What Messiah Yahshua Looked For in His Disciples — A Biblical Pattern for Raising Apostolic Team Leaders Today

Purpose of This Teaching

Messiah Yahshua did not choose His twelve because they were already perfect, educated, powerful, or spiritually mature. He chose ordinary people and formed them into a spiritual family, leaders, shepherds, witnesses, and foundations of His Kingdom.

The same pattern appears throughout Scripture: **Yahshua calls people, transforms them, trains them, sends them, and multiplies His life through them.**

“And He ordained twelve, that they should be with Him, and that He might send them forth to preach.”

— Mark 3:14

Notice the order:

1. **They were with Him** (relationship)
2. **They learned from Him** (training)
3. **They were changed by Him** (transformation)
4. **They were sent by Him** (ministry)

A true team leader must first become a disciple before becoming a leader.

PART ONE

WHAT WAS YAHSHUA LOOKING FOR IN HIS INNER CIRCLE?

1. He Looked for Willing Hearts, Not Perfect People

The Master saw what people could become.

“For man looketh on the outward appearance, but Yahweh looketh on the heart.”

— 1 Samuel 16:7

Yahshua did not choose the twelve because of their résumé. He chose them because He saw the hidden potential inside them.

A leader in the Kingdom is not chosen because they have everything together.

They are chosen because they are:

- teachable
- willing
- obedient
- faithful
- hungry for God
- willing to be corrected

“Not many wise men after the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called.”

— 1 Corinthians 1:26

PART TWO

THE TWELVE DISCIPLES — WHAT YAHSHUA SAW IN EACH ONE

1. PETER (SIMON)

The Impulsive Man Who Became a Shepherd

Background:

- Fisherman
- Strong personality
- Quick speaker
- Quick action

“Now the names of the twelve apostles are these; The first, Simon, who is called Peter...”

— Matthew 10:2

What Yahshua Saw:

Peter had:

1. Courage

Peter was the only disciple who stepped out of the boat.

“Lord, if it be thou, bid me come unto thee on the water.”

— Matthew 14:28

2. Passion

Peter was not passive.

When others left, Peter stayed.

“Lord, to whom shall we go? thou hast the words of eternal life.”
— John 6:68

3. Leadership Ability

Peter naturally became a spokesman.

After receiving the Spirit:

“Peter, standing up with the eleven, lifted up his voice...”
— Acts 2:14

One sermon brought thousands into the Kingdom.

“Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls.”
— Acts 2:41

Transformation:

The man who denied Yahshua became the shepherd who strengthened others.

“Feed my sheep.”
— John 21:17

Team Leader Lesson:

A leader may have weaknesses, but Yahshua can refine passion into purpose.

2. ANDREW

The Connector Who Brought People to Yahshua

Andrew is often overlooked, but he carried a powerful gift.

“Andrew, Simon Peter’s brother, was one of the two which heard John speak, and followed him.”
— John 1:40

Andrew brought:

- Peter to Yahshua
- the boy with five loaves and two fish

“Andrew saith unto him, There is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves, and two small fishes.”
— John 6:8-9

What Yahshua Saw:

Andrew had the gift of:

- invitation
- connection
- finding hidden resources

Team Leader Lesson:

Some leaders preach to thousands. Others bring the person who will.

3. JAMES

The Man of Zeal Who Needed Refining

James and John were called:

“Boanerges, which is, The sons of thunder.”
— Mark 3:17

James had:

- boldness
- intensity
- passion

But his passion needed love.

When Samaria rejected Yahshua:

“Lord, wilt thou that we command fire to come down from heaven?”
— Luke 9:54

Yahshua corrected him.

Transformation:

James became the first apostolic martyr.

“And he killed James the brother of John with the sword.”
— Acts 12:2

Team Leader Lesson:

Passion without love destroys. Passion surrendered to Yahshua builds.

4. JOHN

The Disciple of Love and Revelation

John was:

- close to Yahshua
- present at the cross
- trusted with Mary

“When Yahshua therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved...”

— John 19:26

John became:

- apostle of love
- writer of revelation

“God is love.”

— 1 John 4:8

Team Leader Lesson:

The closest leaders are those who learn the heart of the Master.

5. PHILIP

The Questioning Disciple Who Learned Faith

Philip wanted understanding.

“Philip saith unto him, Lord, shew us the Father, and it sufficeth us.”

— John 14:8

Yahshua used his desire to understand.

Philip also reached others.

“Philip went down to the city of Samaria, and preached Messiah unto them.”

— Acts 8:5

Team Leader Lesson:

Questions are not always unbelief. They can become a doorway into deeper revelation.

6. BARTHOLOMEW (NATHANAEL)

The Honest Heart

Yahshua saw his sincerity.

“Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!”
— John 1:47

He was:

- honest
- searching
- sincere

Team Leader Lesson:

God can train ability, but He requires integrity.

7. MATTHEW

The Transformed Outsider

Matthew was a tax collector.

“And he saith unto him, Follow me. And he arose, and followed him.”
— Matthew 9:9

Society rejected him, but Yahshua restored him.

He became the writer of the Gospel of Matthew.

Team Leader Lesson:

Your past does not disqualify you when Yahshua calls you.

8. THOMAS

The Honest Doubter Who Became a Believer

Thomas struggled with unbelief.

“Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails... I will not believe.”
— John 20:25

Yahshua did not reject him.

He revealed Himself.

“My Lord and my God.”
— John 20:28

Team Leader Lesson:

Honest struggles can become powerful testimonies.

9. JAMES THE LESS

The Faithful Unknown Servant

Little is recorded about him.

This teaches:

The Kingdom needs hidden faithful servants.

“He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much.”
— Luke 16:10

Team Leader Lesson:

Not every leader is famous. Faithfulness matters more than recognition.

10. THADDAEUS (JUDAH/JUDE)

The Seeker of Understanding

He asked Yahshua:

“Lord, how is it that thou wilt manifest thyself unto us, and not unto the world?”

— John 14:22

He wanted to understand the Kingdom.

Team Leader Lesson:

Leaders must seek revelation, not just information.

11. SIMON THE ZEALOT

The Radical Who Was Transformed

Simon belonged to a political revolutionary movement.

Yahshua transformed his zeal.

A former enemy of Rome sat beside Matthew, a former tax collector.

Only Yahshua could create that unity.

“For He is our peace, who hath made both one...”

— Ephesians 2:14

Team Leader Lesson:

The Kingdom creates unity beyond human divisions.

12. JUDAS ISCARIOT

The Warning Example

Judas had:

- opportunity
- authority
- miracles
- teaching

Yet his heart was not surrendered.

“Have not I chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil?”

— John 6:70

Team Leader Lesson:

Calling requires character.

Gifts without surrender can destroy a person.

PART THREE

THE TWELVE BECAME THE ACTS BLUEPRINT

After Yahshua ascended, the disciples continued His pattern.

1. They Prayed Together

“These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication...”

— Acts 1:14

2. They Were Filled With the Holy Spirit

“And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...”

— Acts 2:4

3. They Multiplied Disciples

“And the word of God increased; and the number of disciples multiplied...”

— Acts 6:7

4. They Raised Leaders

Barnabas trained Paul.

Paul trained Timothy.

Timothy trained faithful leaders.

“And the things that thou hast heard of me among many witnesses, the same commit thou to faithful men, who shall be able to teach others also.”

— 2 Timothy 2:2
