John Wesley and the Great Awakening: The Power of the Holy Spirit!

The First Great Awakening, a period of religious revivalism that swept across the American colonies in the mid-18th century, <u>was marked by extraordinary manifestations of the Holy</u> <u>Spirit</u>. One of the most prominent figures during this time was John Wesley, the founder of Methodism.

According to Wesley's own writings and church history, his sermons were often accompanied <u>by powerful spiritual experiences</u>. People would <u>fall under the conviction of the Holy Spirit</u>, tremble violently, and even faint. Many reported receiving the <u>'baptism of the Holy Spirit</u>,' which Wesley believed was <u>a unique experience once from conversion</u>.

These <u>encounters with the Spirit</u> were <u>often accompanied by the gift of speaking in tongues.</u> Wesley referred to this as '<u>jubilation</u>,' and described it as a 'strange and involuntary motion' of the tongue that produced 'a sound like singing.'

<u>The power of the Holy Spirit</u> was so evident at Wesley's meetings that people would sometimes have to be <u>transported home on flatbed wagons</u> and while on the way home, while <u>they</u> <u>continued to speak in tongues</u>. Some individuals would <u>speak for up to three days without</u> <u>ceasing</u>.

Wesley himself witnessed and recorded <u>numerous instances of these extraordinary spiritual</u> <u>manifestations</u>. In his journal, he wrote:

<u>'Many fell to the ground, being seized with strong trembling</u>; and some with violent bodily agitations. <u>Some burst out into a flood of tears</u>, and others into a loud and bitter crying.... Others broke out into singing in the Spirit in tongues, or into the high praises of God; and <u>many into strong and various expressions of joy</u>.'

Wesley believed that these experiences were a <u>genuine work of the Holy Spirit</u> and that they were <u>essential for Christian growth</u>. <u>Wesley taught that the baptism of the Holy Spirit</u> <u>empowered believers with spiritual gifts</u>, an such as <u>the ability to heal those praying for others</u> <u>laying on hands</u>, <u>prophesy</u>, and <u>speak in tongues</u>.

Wesley also believed that <u>the gifts of the Spirit were distributed according to God's will</u> and <u>that all Christians would receive the different gifts by the same Spirit</u>. However, he emphasized <u>that all believers should seek the baptism of the Holy Spirit</u> and that i<u>t was a sign of God's favor upon the receiver</u>.

Wesley's teachings on <u>the Holy Spirit and the gifts of the Spirit</u> had a <u>profound impact</u> on the Methodist movement and further on Christianity as a whole! "When people of his time

claimed that the gifts of the Holy Spirit had ceased, he referred to <u>church history</u> and pointed out that <u>many people</u> after the first century <u>continued to experience and demonstrate the gifts</u> <u>of the Holy Spirit in their times.</u>"

Review

They helped to shape the understanding of the Holy Spirit's role in Christian experience and led to a renewed emphasis on spiritual gifts and the power of God in the lives of believers.
