LET THE APOSTLES SPEAK - Saul Paulus

The Apostle Paul's Message: A Direct Address

Romans Chapter 8: Life in the Spirit [Lord poured is own life into me and it is no longer I who lives but Messiah living in me:** But thanks be to God! Through Yahshua, we are set free from the law of sin and death. The Spirit of God dwells within us, giving us life. The Spirit leads us, guides us, and empowers us to live a life that pleases God. We are no longer under the dominion of the flesh but under the dominion of the Spirit. (Romans 8:1-17)

Living in the Light: Practical Guidance
