MAJOR THEMES OF DIVINE HEALING

1. God reveals Himself as the Healer.
2. Healing demonstrates God's compassion.
3. Healing confirms His message and His messengers.
4. Faith is often connected with healing, though healing remains God's gracious work.
5. Prayer and intercession are important throughout Scripture.
6. Healing can include physical, emotional, spiritual, and relational restoration.
7. Gratitude and obedience are fitting responses to God's healing.
8. Every healing points ultimately to the complete restoration promised in God's kingdom.

Meditation For Depth In The Innerman

For each healing account:

1. Read the passage slowly at least three times.
2. Identify the person's condition and circumstances.
3. Observe how God or Messiah brought healing.
4. Note any role of faith, prayer, repentance, obedience, or compassion.
5. Record what the healing reveals about God's character.
6. Write one personal application.
7. Memorize one key verse from the passage.
8. End with prayer, asking God to deepen your understanding of His Word and conform your life to His will.

This study provides a comprehensive framework for examining the principal supernatural healings recorded in Scripture while encouraging careful meditation on each passage in its biblical context.
